Eight Nations Propose Levy on Premium Air Travel

A coalition of eight countries is advocating for taxes on luxury air travel, specifically targeting business and first-class tickets as well as private jet use. The aim is to generate revenue for climate action and sustainable development, particularly to assist vulnerable nations in adapting to the impacts of climate change. The coalition includes France, Kenya, Barbados, Spain, Somalia, Benin, Sierra Leone, and Antigua and Barbuda, and is supported by the European Commission and the Global Solidarity Levies Task Force (GSLTF). Archer Aviation Secures \$250 Million Investment for eVTOL Development

Archer Aviation received a \$250 million investment from Stellantis to scale production of its Midnight eVTOL aircraft. The funding will support manufacturing and commercial operations, with flight trials already underway in Abu Dhabi. This investment underscores the growing interest in electric vertical takeoff and landing vehicles for urban air mobility.
