Drones pose increasing risk to airliners near major US airports

An alarming increase in drone-related near-miss incidents has been reported near major U.S. airports.

In 2024, drones accounted for nearly twothirds of such incidents, prompting the FAA to explore advanced detection and countermeasure technologies. Read More >>

FAA Issues New Guidance on Runway Safety

In response to a recent crash, the FAA has issued an emergency order grounding New York Helicopter Charter Inc. and initiated a comprehensive review of the company's operations. The grounding was partly due to the company firing its director of operations after he voluntarily ceased flights. The review (Certificate Holder Evaluation Program) will assess the operator's compliance, safety management, and identify risks. Read More >>

The Need for Pilots is Increasing, but the Demand for Mechanics has Surged

Airline pilot hiring has stabilized, with approximately 5,000 pilots hired in 2024, aligning with pre-pandemic figures. While this reflects a normalization, the demand for qualified pilots remains strong. Read More >>

Regional airlines such as Endeavor Air, Horizon Air, Republic Airways, and Piedmont Airlines are not only hiring but are actively recruiting with advertisements, emails, and presences at airshows and recruiting events.

While demand has steadily returned for pilots, there is one aviation field where demand has spiked - aircraft mechanics. After the pandemic, the aviation market had to address a lack of airline pilots. Many airlines over-hired in 2023 and '24. However, the lack of aircraft mechanics was never addressed in the same manner.

Why? There simply aren't as many places to train mechanics as there are pilots. Thus, demand for qualified and eager mechanics is still strong.
